We are not happy with the percentages of students below grade level.

Hilary: We are doing WIN this year, where we flood the classroom with support staff. Support staff work with students in small groups to develop their literacy.

Jesus Barrios: When I was little, I was very low in literacy. After school I would stay and receive academic help. After attending this program, my reading levels sky rocketed. This really helped me and my sister, since we are bilingual.

Hilary: Our ELD students receive small group instruction during WIN time.

Dan: Per the court order we have to provide ELD to all our kids. We are five days in and will probably need to make changes based on our reflections.

Waugh: This is really important because district wide we have 20,000 students on Read Acts. Teachers are working in the classroom trying to build up those skills in elementary.

Pete: We lose students coming from 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Some of this data is based on students that are no longer attending to KCAA.

Yanel: She said that she has a niece that didn't like school. Her mom started becoming involved in learning as well. Now Yanel's niece is on honors program at Kennedy High School.

Dan: 90% attendance at parent teacher conferences. 50% of our students don't attend pre-school.

Dan and Hilary: He talked about recruitment of students from Denison and Pascual Le Doux

Erika: Why are we on green?

Hilary: Says in elementary we are green for closing the gap among ELL, green for closing academic gaps for students in poverty, and green for closing gaps for students of color.
